





# AL **IRISH** REMEMBERED FOR HIS MEMORY AND KIND HEART By Taylor Viles

Al Irish first attended a Cape Cod Baseball League game in 1925, supporting the Falmouth Commodores at their original field in Falmouth Heights. It was 94 years later, at their second home of Guy Fuller Field, that he threw out the first pitch during a game. The summer of 2019 became the final season of summer baseball Irish would see.

He passed away on February 20 at the age of 101, but not without leaving behind a legacy that only a century of life could earn a person. A legacy not only spanning the baseball world, but including the Falmouth Masonic Lodge, the Falmouth Historical Society, and St. Barnabas Episcopal Church.

Through each civic engagement, his radiant energy affected the people he worked with. It is through those people with whom his legacy lies. It is those people who remember Irish the way he deserves to be remembered: a man with dedication and a driving passion for his involvements and his family.

"Al was a sweetheart. He did not have one ounce of bad bone in his body. He loved everyone, cared about everyone, and if he met you and got to know you, he wouldn't forget you," said Cape League President, Chuck Sturtevant.

The Cape League was Irish's first love as he spent his childhood watching the Commodores. But he didn't just enjoy the games as a fan, he remembered the players and paid close attention to every detail.

"You could pretty much ask him anything and he'd have the answer," said Commodores Board of Director's member Donna Curtis.

Irish was an encyclopedia derived from a life of solving puzzles, according to his eldest son. "He was in cryptography in World War II," said David. "For years, well into his 90s, he would do the cryptograms and the jumbles in the Cape Cod Times every day, successfully." Although these puzzles may not have helped his knowledge of baseball,




they were part of what kept him young.

After his military involvement and various off-Cape endeavors, Irish and his wife Esther, moved their family to Falmouth in 1961, a place he hadn't lived since he was 18. He rekindled his love of Cape Cod baseball and shared his childhood passion with his sons. He taught them to play catch and took them to games, but he never asked them to adopt his love for the game for themselves. "A lot of people think of sportspeople as kind of rabid, [but] dad was a quiet sports fan," said David. "He never shoved it off on Brad or me. He appreciated it and he exposed us to it, but he wasn't somebody who was going to push you in a direction that you didn't want to go."

Irish retired in 1985 at the age of 66, and while many retirees struggle to find ways to keep busy, he took full advantage of the newfound free time.

"He had a lot of books, and we used to kiddingly buy him books and say, 'Dad, are you going to read these someday?'" David remembers. "Well, guess what? When he retired, he did. He was incredibly disciplined."

With many rainouts, over 50 collegiate baseball players from around the country and the longest win streak in 'Dores history, the 2019 Falmouth Commodores season was historic.

For the third time in the past four seasons, manager Jeff Trundy led the Commodores to the top of the Western Division in the regular season. The 'Dores also finished with the best record in the CCBL.

But no matter who was involved, whether it was new general manager Chris Fitzgerald or the coaching staff, Trundy felt the players were the influential piece of this season.

"The players defined the season without question," Trundy said. "This was a really, really special group of kids and they made the season what it was."

Multiple 'Dores finished the regular season with awards. Coach Jeff Trundy won the CCBL's Manager of the Year, reliever Zach Brzykcy (Virginia Tech) was selected as the Russ Ford Outstanding Relief Pitcher, outfielder Austin Masel (Holy Cross) earned the Manny Robello 10th Player Award and outfielder Zach Deloach (Texas A&M) received the Thurman Munson Batting Champion Award. Deloach finished with the best batting average on the Cape. This followed a season at Texas A&M where De-

loach batted .200 in 160 at-bats.

"I had to open up my eyes and see the atmosphere," the

6-foot-2, 200-pound right fielder said. "Being able to be with your teammates and knowing they have your back and you have theirs is what it's really all about." What was also unforgettable was the rain. The Commodores had the most rainouts of any team in any summer collegiate baseball league with a total of 14. In June, five consecutive games were postponed due to rain. This led to a stretch of 32 games in 31 days throughout the month of July. There were little-to-no off days for the Falmouth Commodores for the rest of the season. July 2019 was a magical time for the Falmouth Commodores. The highlight of the season was an 11-game win-streak that capped off the month. This was the longest win-streak in modern Commodores history. In the postseason, the 'Dores defeated the Bourne Braves in the first round of the playoffs. The series took three games. Falmouth ended their season in the Western Division Championship Series after getting swept by the 2019 Cape League champion Cotuit Kettleers.

Every year manager Jeff Trundy wants his team to have fun and appreciate the small details about the game. While the season didn't end with a championship, the 2019 Falmouth Commodores truly had fun and developed into a strong family.

#### FALMOUTH COMMODORES AND CAPE COD BASEBALL LEAGUE (CCBL) DOMINATE 2020 MLB DRAFT

The 2020 Major League Baseball (MLB) draft was unusual in many aspects mainly due to the Covid-19 pandemic. The usual June event was delayed to July and the number of rounds for selecting players was dramatically reduced from 40 to 5. That meant instead of drafting 1268 players in 40 rounds, it was reduced to 160 players chosen from colleges and high schools in the U.S. and abroad. This represented a sharp reduction in amateur players making it into the MLB system. Not surprisingly, the CCBL and the Commodores fared very well. Of the 160 players selected, 73 (46%) played in the Cape Cod Baseball League, 12 of whom were former Commodores (9 drafted and 3 signed as free agents).

Cliff was born and raised in Corpus Christi, TX, and attended Texas A&M University as a baseball player, where he is currently an assistant

coach. As a Falmouth Commodore in 2004, Cliff helped lead the team to the divisional championship. Cliff impacted the team with both his advanced defensive prowess at SS and solid contributions with the bat, hitting .277 with 3 HRs, 21 RBIs, and 21 stolen bases.

Besides reading, his love for the Commodores kept his summers full. He transitioned from a fan to a board member and began running the entrance gate for home games. Gary Rebesa joined Irish to help run the gate in the early 2000s and remembers him for his humor and his drive to stay young. "When he was 95, we were at the gate and he says 'guess what I did today,'" said Rebesa, guoting Irish. "'I went to renew my license today.' I said 'You did?... How'd you make out?' He said, 'when I got all done, they told me I'm good until I'm 100.'"

He stopped driving during year 97 when he moved into Atria Woodbriar assisted living, but that didn't stop him from his participation in Falmouth's baseball team. Commodores board members would pick him up and drive him wherever he needed to go, whether it was a game, a Commodores board meeting, or even a Hall of Fame advisory board meeting, for which he consulted because of his recall

What made him different from most wasn't just his memory though, it was the way he handled himself. "It was not about him. It was about everyone else, and he showed that," said Sturtevant.

This showed in conversation as Brad acknowledged his father's ability to listen. He picked and chose when to input his thoughts, but when he did, they were well thought out. "If someone mentioned something that he knew he could add to the information about, he was extraordinary in the amount of detail he could offer to the conversation," said Brad.

When it came to remembering past players or memories, Irish never referred to his notes; in fact, he didn't have any notes. "One thing that really impressed me is my father would never write anything down. He'd say, 'I have it all up here,'" said David, pointing to his head. "But he never missed this trick. He never goofed up."


This kept Irish's brain active, leading to his sharpness in his later years, but his longevity and health were likely aided by how he took care of his body. His sons explained their father's stubbornness about eating unhealthy food. He never let them go to fast-food restaurants and only when he was out of town on business did they enjoy a pizza, courtesy of their mother.

Irish and Esther had an "incredible marriage," according to Brad. Even through their older years, the couple shared an evening ritual Brad says led to his Dad's lifespan. "They enjoyed going out for a nice evening walk. It was religious. I mean, as long as the weather was halfway decent," said Brad. "Dad was not a weekend warrior when it came to exercise, but he always got in his daily constitution in terms of walking."

Before Irish's death, Brad asked what his secret was to living a long and happy life. "He said 'moderation,'" Brad remembers. "Basically, he would engage in many things, but he wasn't one to overdo it, he had a lot of variety. In many ways, because he was low key about it, I think he was able to enjoy other people's successes and watch them enjoy it, I think gave him a lot."

Irish's dedication to the Commodores and the Cape League earned him the league's lifetime achievement award in 2007.


## CHRIS FITZGERALD GENERAL MANAGER




#### MIKE LANDRY ASSISTANT COACH




## MICHAEL CURIALLE UCLA


# BRAYDEN TAYLOR **TEXAS CHRISTIAN UNIVERSITY**



# **GUV FULLER FIELD IMPROVEMENTS 2021**




Diagram describing new construction and improvements to Guv Fuller Field

The planned Guv Fuller Field renovation project scheduled for construction in 2020 got sidetracked due to the Covid-19 pandemic; however it is on track for construction in September of 2021. The original approvals of the funds from the Community Preservation Committee (CPC) (approved in December 2019) and the Falmouth Town Meeting (delayed until September 2020) was for an amount thought to be more than sufficient to cover the entire project. However, contruction and material costs dramatically increased during the pandemic resulting in insufficient funding following the bidding process. Tremendous flexibility shown by the CPC and the Town were exhibited as an urgent funding request was approved by the CPC for an additional \$314,045 bring-
